LOCAL RULES

(to be read in conjunction with the Rules of Golf and any Temporary Local Rules)

- Out of Bounds: Rule 27 to be read in conjunction with the local Rules Board
 - 1. Beyond any fence bounding the course.
 - 2. Other areas as defined by white stakes.

2. Immovable Obstructions: Rule 24-2

- Trees and shrubs under 2 club lengths in height interfering with a players stance or area of intended swing. Relief must be taken.
- Hoops, ropes, stakes and tree guards. Relief must be taken.
- All structures concerning watering systems: all man made constructions, i.e. Tee markers, signs, control boxes, electricity poles, all artificial paths and retaining walls. Relief may be taken. Line of sight relief is not allowed.
- 4. Sprinkler heads in addition if such obstruction is within 2 club lengths of the putting green of the hole being played, interferes with the intended line of play between the ball and the hole, the player may obtain relief without penalty as follows: a ball lying off the putting green but not in a penalty area and is within two club lengths of the intervening obstruction, the ball may be lifted, cleaned and dropped at the nearest point to where the ball lay which:
 - a. is not nearer the hole
 - b. avoids such intervention and

c. is not in a hazard or on the putting green.

3. Abnormal Ground Conditions: Rule 25

- Areas defined by blue stakes, white lines or GUR signage are:
- Ground Under Repair. Relief must be taken.
- Solidly embedded stones 'through the green'. Relief may be taken
- 4. Distance Measuring Devices: Rule 4.3
 - 4.1 A player may obtain distance information using a device that measures distance only.

Notes: Measurements on fairway:

White Disc or Post 50m to centre of green Red Disc or Post 100m to centre of green Blue Disc or Post 150m to centre of green Yellow Disc or Post 200m to centre of green

Red Stakes/Lines Penalty Areas White Stakes Out Of Bounds Blue Stakes & White Lines Ground Under Repair

Penalty for breach of a local rule Stroke play – 2 strokes Match play – loss of hole

Please fix all divots (including in the rough) even if they are not yours

PLEASE FIX ALL DIVOTS

It is up to members to make sure that all PUG marks are repaired on the greens

Players headed out for the shotgun start having been welcomed by President Ern Kraulis and briefed on local rules by Bendigo Golf Club General Manager, Brock Rogers. A nutritious lunch pack was provided for players to enjoy during their round and I'm sure all appreciated the generosity of the host club for giving each player a club ball marker and pitch repair tool. I hope plenty of greens were hit to get good use out of the pitch repairer!

Many found the greens challenging and hard to read. About half of the assumed break seemed to be the consensus of the players that I spoke to.


